
The Department held a badging ceremony for K9 Beny and Officer Olsen.




The Department received a donation of "Duffels for Kids" from the Faith, Hope and Love organization. The duffels are given to children in crisis.




**2019/2020 Year to Date
Calls for Service**




**2019/2020 Year to Date
Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)**




Reported Crime Comparison July 2019/2020



Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date




July 2020 Allocation of Police Services





North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction




* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center

Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.
 Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.



The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SRO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SRO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school.

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.

There were 0 calls for service at the BDMHS and 0 calls for service at the BMES.
